A range of activities will be used to help delegates assess and review how they recognise learning and involve service users. This training is suitable for anyone working with young people who wishes to explore different ways of involving service users and recognising skills in young people. Rewards for Learning

Nurturing success in young people with housing issues

In 2007 SCSH conducted a survey of methods for rewarding learning used in youth housing services. The survey provides a snapshot of how the 39 surveyed projects recognise learning in young people, what methods they are using to do this, and what barriers they have encountered. The report provides a directory of methods for recognising skills ranging from awards and accreditation to informal methods.



Service User Involvement

A study of youth housing services in Scotland

This survey looks at different kinds of service user involvement activity and the extent of such activity across Scotland. The report sets out a straightforward mapping tool – adapted from Arnstein's well-known ladder of participation - which can be used by youth housing support projects to assess the service user involvement taking place within their own organisation.
